Note From the Editor

During the December holiday season, while Canada is filled with cold weather and snow, I had the pleasure of attending a 2-week life changing religious pilgrimage through the <u>Return to Roots</u> program hosted in India. The program is a youth initiative started in 2012 designed to strengthen the idea of the Zoroastrian identity among the global youth, and to bridge the disconnect between Zoroastrians in the diaspora and their ancestral communities in Iran and India.

Running from December 21st to January 4th, the organizers exposed our group to various Parsi pillars of the community in India. Taking us to various businesses like Tata Institute, Godrej Township and Dotiwalla Café to name a few. They took us to cultural sites like the Sanjan Stambh and Varoli Beach - the site of the first Zoroastrian landings in India. We had the pleasure of meeting and mingling with influential personalities like Della Resorts owner Jimmy Mistry, and Khojeste Mistree who imparted their knowledge about our religion and the impact the Parsi community has and continues to have in India, while answering all of our prepared questions we had for them.

Return to Roots 7 Report

As I reflect on our recent journey, three distinct elements stand out: the organizers, attendees, and supporters. Let's start with the organizers, whose unwavering dedication to Zoroastrianism was evident in every detail of our experience. Without exaggeration, for fourteen days, I lived entirely in the present moment, free from dwelling on the past or fretting about the future. I must admit that a significant part of this sense of serenity stemmed from the meticulously planned and comprehensive itinerary arranged by the organizers. They invested not only time and energy but also their own funds to ensure our trip was unforgettable. Equally impressive were the supporters, who welcomed us with open arms and treated us like cherished family members, embodying the spirit of generosity and happiness that defines our community.

A pivotal highlight of our trip was our visit to Udvada, a sacred site steeped in spiritual significance. It was there, during the midnight Boi ceremony, that I had a truly spiritual awakening. Unlike the routine

prayers I was accustomed to, this experience was transcendent. In the sacred space of the Atash Bahram, my prayers felt different. As I gazed into the fire and observed the Mobed conducting rituals, a sense of tranquility enveloped me. The gentle sound of the Mobed's voice, the aroma of burning Sandalwood, and the soft glow of candles created an atmosphere of wonder and reverence. It was a moment of pure connection with my faith, one that filled me with a deep sense of pride and belonging.

Another spiritually enriching experience was the Jashan ceremony held aboard a boat. The blending of religious practice and the vast expanse of the sea was truly remarkable. As I sat on the boat amidst the gentle sway of the waves, surrounded by the sounds of seagulls and the comforting presence of beloved friends, I felt a profound sense of peace and harmony. Every sense was heightened in that moment—the sight of the sea, the sound of the Mobeds' chants, the smell of Sandalwood, the taste of pomegranate seeds, and the feeling of kinship with those around me. It was a truly unforgettable experience, one that left an indelible mark on my soul.

Third element of this trip was my dearest friends. When I chatted with them, I felt at ease, trusted, and appreciated. We were open-minded and supportive, without any judgment. During our downtime, we played Mafia, weaving its storyline into our trip and immersing ourselves fully. After the trip, I felt like a member of a 30-member family spread across the globe, yet our hearts remained closely connected. Another fascinating aspect was the diverse range of cultures everyone encountered, especially while staying with different roommates. It offered a valuable opportunity to learn about various customs, beliefs, and viewpoints on life, the world, and Zoroastrianism. On the

trip, I was joined with peers from all over the world including folks from USA, Canada, the UK, Pakistan, Singapore, Australia, India of course and from my home country Iran as well. It broadened perspectives and encouraged contemplation on the meaning of life and one's role in the world.

While prayer and spiritual connection are vital, they constitute only a small part of our responsibilities in this world. We are also tasked with caring for God's creations and preserving the environment. Throughout our journey, we put these principles into action by

joining a Clean Green program in Udvada and tidying up the beach. Despite focusing on a small stretch, these actions served as a powerful reminder of our duty to care for the environment and appreciate the gifts of nature bestowed upon us by God.

Moreover, our visits to places like infirmaries, elderly homes, orphanages, and hospitals offered us chances to connect with individuals who, despite their challenges, radiated kindness and hope. This humbling experience emphasized the significance of lending a helping hand and sharing happiness with those in difficult situations. Whether through conversation, games, or music and dance, we endeavored to uplift their spirits and bring warmth to their lives.






